Abstract

Series of killing of Journalists in Nigeria can never be over-emphasized because it has been an eye-sore to the nation both at home and abroad. Three hundred and thirty nine,(349) of attacks on journalists happened in Nigeria yearly. Also, 4 journalists were killed on the job within a period of eight months April – November, 2017, shot dead by unidentified attackers in Nigeria and at least 36 Nigerian journalists were attacked between January and July this year, with 30 of the attacks recorded during the 2019 general elections. This article was to determine the safety of journalists in Nigeria. Questionnaire was used to generate data from 200 respondents using simple random sampling techniques. The findings revealed that, the level of safety of journalists in Nigeria is moderate. This can be possible because of awareness created by both government and general public for safety of journalists. The findings also revealed that, there is no significant different in perception of male and female journalists on safety of journalists. This may be possible because of what has happened to the journalists in times of covering events is not always spare sex, the hoodlums attacks and molestation is always done to both. In the findings, it was shown that, there is no significant different in perception of print media and broadcast media journalists in times of covering events. This may happen because of their experiences in the field of journalism, both print and broadcast media have witness the same things in terms of harassment from the public. Therefore, it is recommended that media organizations should intensify their effort by providing necessary protecting materials for journalists in times of covering events.






